July 9-16, 2016



The Special Report contained details about April's Wakenaam Island Crusade, but brief statements are due here as well. God repopulated the postdiluvian world with eight souls, and it took only eight people (three from the States and five Guyanese) to revive the dead Wakenaam church. Prior to our work, they hadn't met for over two years. God doubled the size of the congregation during the crusade with three baptisms. And thirteen were present on the first Sunday assembly after we left. The pilot light has been lit, but it must grow. Will you commit one week to help this struggling church?
