



Urgent need of your monthly support for these preachers to provide for their families! Help Mow!



The Situation:

Preacher stipends were established 10 years ago as part of the mission work in Guyana. Even with steady inflation, there has not been an increase in monthly stipends for 10 years.

Part-time preachers receive only \$150 a month to help feed and support their family. Full-time preachers get only \$300 a month. *Could you and your family live on that amount?*

Some preachers have as many as 8, 9, 10 & 11 children. One preacher has 2 special-needs adult children living with them, one is a deaf mute. Please use your blessing to help them. **The Need:**

There is a **very urgent need of an additional \$5,000 a month to continue to fund the preacher stipends**. That is an additional \$60,000 a year! Unless the money is raised, good men who are preaching the Gospel in Guyana will have to get other jobs. That would mean less time for study, or visitation, or being a preacher. They desperately depend on receiving that support. In fact, if the stipend arrives late, they have sold personal items in order to eat or for their children to continue to attend school. They should never have to face that situation

What you can do:

Please consider sponsoring one or more of these Gospel preachers. Some of the preachers and their wives are pictured on the other side of this newsletter. Personal life stories can be provided so that you can decide which preacher to sponsor. Or

if you prefer, you can sponsor a congregation. A very brief history of each congregation and map location can be provided to help you choose. Please don't delay in deciding to help.

The Mission continues:

Jerry O. Davidson, who lovingly started the Amerindian Missions work in 1999 established around 30 congregations in the interior of Guyana. For 5 years, Brother Jerry mentored missionary David Paher as Paul did to Timothy. Due to health, Jerry had to retire June 2, 2018. David is continuing Jerry's important mission work legacy in Guyana.

"David chose to call his mission work Living Water 414. This ministry mostly works in Guyana and will grow in other areas as God opens that door. Living Water 414 is a foreign evangelistic ministry overseen by the eldership of the Richmond Church of Christ in Richmond, Kentucky. Please pray for his work."

Additional Needs:

Support is also needed to continue to fund three annual campaigns to Guyana. There is equipment such as tents, cookware, generators, motorcycles for preachers, and one truck to be maintained; and there is continual needs for Bibles, songbooks, Bible class materials, and teaching supplies.

Please help do all that you can to continue the preacher support, for their sake and their family's welfare. We are earnestly pleading for your immediate assistance.
