2015 schedule: <u>Another reason</u> to be excited about this year is because this spring campaign is the first of six trips planned over the next twelve months:

Mar. 2 – 30 campaign, follow-up & teach April 24 – May 11 teach & follow-up work 3 different campaigns Sept. 18 – Oct. 19 Nov. 28 – Dec.14 Jan. 25 – Feb. 15 campaign, follow-up & teach & follow-up work teach & follow-up work

The classes that I plan to teach during these trips will be 1 & 2 Chronicles, Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Minor Prophets, Servant Leadership (from the Gospels), Jesus on the End Times, 1 & 2 Thessalonians and James.

Our three goals are campaign work, followup work and to teach in the preaching school. We are doing what we planned! Thank you for helping to make it possible!

We have the commitments and pledges to plan and schedule these trips, and we trust in God that those plans will be realized. Will you help make that happen? No gift is too small. But God cannot bless zero.

Guyana memory: St. Cuthbert's lies among the northern Guyana regions. I visited this village twice last year: in July and October. On one particular night of preaching during my first visit, it rained, hard; actually, "downpour" doesn't even describe the torrential rainfall which intensified as I continued my lesson. The usually peaceful sound of raindrops on a metal roof was drowned out (pun intended) by the roar of water pouring from the heavens. At several instances, I halted briefly my lesson and simply stared at the audience being unable to project my words with clarity and precision to the folks in the front seat, not to mention the ones in the very back of the elongated building. I thought of Demosthenes, that ancient Greek orator who shouted over the ocean waves with a mouth filled with pebbles. Jerry Davidson shook his head in compassion for the unusual situation; I read his eyes, which said, "Let's make the most of it, do your best." I was tempted to stop the lesson, but I had something to say and I didn't want to give Satan an inch.

In October, I was invited to preach on Sunday morning. It rained again with severity and loudness that only matched the previous occasion. Pausing periodically to rest my voice and to reflect on Demosthenes, I was reminded of the unusual struggles of evangelizing Guyana.

I leave March 2 for Guyana, and I'll be there for nearly a full month. I travel with a team to Karaisabai Village for a major campaign. Upon completion, I will remain in Lethem to teach two classes in Guyana Christian University: Job & James. Pray for my travels, for good fruit, and for my family.
