Dear Readers:

This issue begins with my immediate presence in Guyana. After two administrative days with government offices, I will join James Pendley from Alabama and Derrick John from Moraikobai Village. Together we travel early Sunday morning on March 6 to assist the despaired saints at Monkey Mountain for a couple of days.

A recent visit revealed negative influences in the church and community. Our purpose is to ensure that those problems are no longer present, to encourage the members and to lay a plan for long-term growth. Please add this church to your prayers. Also, if you would like to send an encouraging note to these discouraged Christians in Monkey Mountain, please send it via email or snail mail using the information in this newsletter. Make sure it is marked “for Monkey Mountain Christians,” and I will make sure they get it.

On Tuesday, James, Derrick and I will travel by 4x4 truck for approximately 14 hours to join the Amerindian Missions team already campaigning in Lethem. The usual daily Bible studies and nightly lessons will continue through Friday, March 11. Some team members will return home to the States that weekend, but others will visit other villages.

However, I will remain in Lethem for two additional weeks to teach in GCU. My subjects are “Sermon Preparation & Delivery” and “Homiletics.”

**Wakenaam Island:** I want to highlight two trips on April 16-23 and July 9-16. Both one-week visits will help the church on Wakenaam Island. I first discovered this dead church in October, and I need your prayerful, financial and evangelistic help to revive it.

In April, Neil Richey and Scott Ihle (members of the Piedmont Road church in Marietta, Georgia) will accompany me to conduct Bible studies and nightly lessons.

In July, I will lead a team to Wakenaam Island for further gospel efforts. If you have expressed to me in the past an interest of traveling to Guyana, this is your opportunity. The April trip will give me an exact sense on costs, but \$2000 may give you an indication at this time.

**“Get To Know Guyana”:** On Sunday, February 21, the Richmond church of Christ hosted a special event where members could *experience* Guyana. It was a success because Christians could see, hear, touch and taste Guyana without passports and plane rides.

The day began and ended with three lessons about missions. I presented our evangelistic work during Bible class, and I preached “How Foreign Missions Helps the Local Congregation” for worship. Our missions deacon, Jason Kumfer, preached on “A Missionary’s Heart” that evening.

The afternoon activities were special, too. Having prepared some of the ladies in Guyanese cuisine several months ago, we ate curry chicken, bake (ironically, a fried bread) and salted fish, and chicken-on-a-stick. Videos of my work and of Guyana’s natural habit were presented, and Amerindian crafts were on display. A hands-on exhibit allowed participants to try their skill at genuine Amerindian bows, arrows and slingshots.
