Dear Readers:

I am off to Guyana this month to help a campaign in a new way. A team of US Christians traveled to Lethem on February 20. I will arrive just prior to their departure to follow up on the baptisms, restorations and visits that were made. It is my prayer that this coordinated effort will close the revolving door of new converts.

Wakenaam Island is also in need of a visit. Clinton Fredrick is new to local ministry and needs instruction and guidance. Also, the efforts have begun for the foundation of the new church building. Pray for this work.

Marriage Officers: One of the most exciting developments has been the prospect of appointing our own Marriage Unfortunately Officers. bureaucracy is slow and difficult. For example, civil officials made no mention of Registering Buildings until after submitted the applications for Marriage Officers, despite repeated steps to seek guidance of the complete process beforehand. (In Guyana, it is the law for marriages to be conducted in buildings that are registered with the government. Home marriages are technically illegal, therefore.)

If this process was in the US, it would take less than one day because of our excellent roads and vehicles. In Guyana, however, we are approaching one year with no end in sight. The shear logistical challenge and infrastructure deficiency slow our progress to a crawl. We press on so that they have a chance for marital godly living.
