Dear Readers:

Many Guyanese churches need help, instruction, and guidance, which brings me to Guyana for the fifth time this year. (By contrast, five trips are usually made over twelve months.) The number of visits is not because of excess funds: I'm not sure what that looks like. The truth is that while you read this news, the funds run critically low. But, with our hand to the plow, we trust in the God who provides the ram in the bush. Now is a great time to get involved in this ever growing, quickly expanding evangelistic mission effort. Satan is strong, and the work is tough, but "greater is He who is in us, than he who is in the world."

Campaign Preview: In a few weeks, twelve Christians from the US will travel to Lethem, Guyana for a ten-day crusade. This effort will build upon past work for this newly restored church. In truth, Lethem is "Plan C." As much as we are really needed again in Lethem, two other locations – Kroudar and Maruranau villages – are young and struggling and were the focus of our attention. Both groups meet in homes as there is no regular preacher or public building. Limited efforts have been made previously, so we greatly anticipate the day when we can bring a full campaign in both of these areas. Pray for opened doors!

For those familiar with these campaigns, we conduct Bible studies each day and conduct nightly crusades. I will be directly involved and remain until October 23 when I will begin my trek homeward. Eleven days before that team arrives, I will travel to Guyana for follow-up work in additional areas. I will revisit Wakenaam and Mourca briefly and conduct a day seminar along the Pomeroon River. As you can tell, "To the work, to the work...."

Special Need: One of our very best local evangelists left his post for home. We have not heard anything from him, and don't know if he is dead physically, spiritually, or emotionally. For nearly two years, I have intended to pay him a visit at his home in Mabaruma since we cannot get ahold of him, but the funds to travel there have impeded my ambition. However, since I will be half the distance to Mabaruma during this upcoming trip, I can continue on for what I may anticipate to be about \$500. Of the 20 Guyanese preachers I could name, he is easily among the top three for his knowledge, enthusiasm, and personality. Add to that, wherever he has been located (Lethem, Monkey Mtn., Sand Creek, Moruca, Karaisabai), he has been very effective and well-liked. Moreover, we have lost a few good preachers to death or desertion. Will you help me procure a great preacher for this work? I'm ready to depart.
